The theme, "I Made You Wonderful" from Psalm 139:14, serves as a beautiful reminder of God's creative work in each of us and His love of diversity. This verse expresses a sense of awe and gratitude for God's craftsmanship, not just in our physical being, but in the unique purpose and identity He gives each life.


Kilmacanogue



The next Talk KHS is on Monday 3rd March at 8pm in Kilmacanogue Parish Hall.

We have Dr Bruce Misstear speaking on the subject of "Holy Wells, Hydrogeology and Healing Reputations." Sacred wells are found across the world and are still venerated in many societies. In Ireland, mapping in the 19th century recorded around 3,000 holy wells, including about 100 in County Wicklow. Dr Bruce Misstear is a Fellow Emeritus of Trinity College Dublin, where he has taught hydrogeology and environmental engineering for 30 years. Prior to academia, he worked on groundwater projects in Africa, Middle East and Asia as well as in the UK. He is the author of numerous publications, including his recent book "Wells and Wellbeing: The Hydrogeology of Irish Holy Wells."


A Helpful Resource for Lent
