

A simple way to prayer

Open Our hearts Lord



John Main wrote a simple prayer which is recited before the start of meditation and which reads as follows: *Heavenly Father, Open Our Hearts to the silent Presence of the Spirit of your Son. Lead us into that mysterious Silence where Your Love is revealed to all who call.* The first reflection in this series explored the opening words 'Heavenly Father'; in this reflection I'd like to focus on the phrase 'Open Our Hearts'. In asking God to open our hearts we recognise that while meditation is an expression of our intention to simply be with Him, it is God who works on us, not the other way around. We approach meditation from an attitude of being willing rather than wilful. And that calls us to be open to being changed by our meditation and to recognise that so often we are closed and wilful because of our conditioning and our desire for power, prestige and possessions.

History



Kilmacanogue History Society are delighted to have the Talk that had to be deferred last January, now on **Monday May 12th at 8pm** in Kilmacanogue Parish Hall. It's the last Talk before our Autumn Season. Our Speaker is Garry Ahern talking about "The 'Southern Cross' Global Circumnavigation"- this flight took off from Portmarnock in 1930- it was part of the first true aerial circumnavigation of the globe, (i.e. by one aircraft, with the same pilot, while crossing the equator twice). It includes the role played by Irish Aviator Captain Paddy Saul (1895-1968), who was a major player on the flights and would go on to found the Irish Air Traffic Control Service. As his final resting place he chose St. Patrick's Churchyard, Enniskerry. All welcome.
